The Village of Oak Lawn is pleased to announce our partnership with the Oak Lawn Park District for our 2010 Earth Day celebration. Please join our neighbors and community members at the Wolfe Wildlife for educational displays, giveaways, raffles and other fun activities.

We can all do our part in the Village's continued effort to be more ecologically responsible. Here are some things that you can do to help in this global effort:

- **Rain Barrels** – The Village has a limited supply of MWRD rain barrels for sale at \$50 a piece. They are available in blue, black or tan. Order forms are available at the Village Hall.
- **Recycle, Reduce & Reuse** - Think twice before you throw something out. The Village receives 50% of the recycling profits. This is an easy, painless source of revenue for the Village. Please note that when you put something not acceptable into the recycle toter, it reduces the quality of recycling material and the amount of profit the Village receives. There is a list of what is and what is not acceptable in every edition of the *A Community United*.
- **Proper Medication Disposal** – **DO NOT FLUSH & DO NOT POUR** unused medications! Dispose of unused medication in household trash. Pour medication into a sealable plastic bag. If it is a solid, crush it or add water to dissolve it. Add kitty litter, coffee grounds or something to make it less appealing to pets and children. Remove all personal information before throwing away. Check to see if there are any local collection programs to drop off.
- **Earth911.com** is a website loaded with information as to how to properly dispose of items. Visit the website and enter what you want to dispose and your zip code and you'll receive a list of the nearest collection sites.

Your questions...our answers

You asked: When can we start putting out yard waste?

We answered: Yard waste pickup begins Monday, **April 5**. Yard waste totes are available for \$40. There is no maximum weight capacity if you use the yard waste totes. Order forms are available at the Cashier's Window at the Village Hall. Yard waste may also be disposed of in a 32 gallon container with a yard waste label (available at the Village Hall) or a bio-degradable yard waste bag. The waste shall weigh no more than 50 lbs per container. Brush should be bundled in 4 ft. lengths and no larger than 2 ft in diameter.





- Metal cans

PAPER



- White, colored, glossy paper
- Catalogs
