Your questions...our answers

You asked: What is the curfew in Oak Lawn for teenagers?

We answered: According to Village Code 10-4-1: It is unlawful for a person less than eighteen years of age to be present at any public assembly or in any public building, park, sidewalk, street or highway or other public place:

- a. Sundays – Thursdays: Between 10:30 pm & 6:00 am the following day.
- b. Fridays & Saturdays: Between 11:30 pm & 6:00 am the following day.

Water Restrictions are in effect as of **May 15**. Odd numbered addresses may water on odd days and even numbered addresses on even days from **7:00 – 11 am** and **7:00 – 11 pm**. Automated underground sprinkling systems may be used between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m.

Circuit Breaker and Illinois Cares Rx

The Illinois 1363 Application for Circuit Breaker and Illinois Cares Rx is the form you must use if you choose to apply for a Circuit Breaker grant, optional help paying for prescription drugs or a license plate discount. The requirements are:

- You must be 65 years of age or older before January 1, 2010 or totally disabled.
- Your total income in 2009 must be less than \$27,610 if filing for yourself or \$36,635 if filing for yourself and your spouse.
