Water Restrictions. Odd numbered addresses may water on odd days and even numbered addresses on even days from **7:00 – 11 am** and **7:00 – 11 pm**. Automated underground sprinkling systems may be used between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m.

2010-2011 Vehicle Stickers are available for purchase. Please bring your pre-printed form that you receive in the mail to purchase your sticker at the Village Hall. The fee is \$25 and senior citizens are eligible for one \$5 discounted sticker per household. Stickers must be affixed to your windshield by midnight, August 16 to avoid the \$10 penalty and an additional fine. **Hours:** Monday – Friday, 8:30 am to 5:00 pm. The Cashier's Window is open until 8:00 pm the second and fourth Tuesday of each month.

You asked: Do you have bus service for seniors?

We answered: Yes, the Village does provide free bus service for Oak Lawn Seniors and Handicapped Residents. Bus service is now available five days a week. Service is provided anywhere within the Oak Lawn boundaries, Chicago Ridge Mall and the Nutrition Site in Hometown between the hours of 8:30 am and 3:30 pm. 

- 65 years of age or older before January 1, 2010 or totally disabled.
- Your total income in 2009 must be less than \$27,610 if filing for yourself or \$36,635 if filing for yourself and your spouse.
