The Village Board has agreed to pass a 2012 budget with no property tax increase.





The hauling of any and all items from the resident’s vehicle to the collection containers is the sole responsibility of the resident.



(Village is not responsible for any information stored on computer equipment left for recycling)
- Take materials to the drop-off **ONLY** during hours of operation.

- Please place materials carefully in boxes indicated by signs at the site.
- DO NOT TAKE any items that have already been dropped off. Once items have been placed in the collection box, they are part of the Recycling Program.
- This area will be monitored via video surveillance twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.


