Village of Oak Lawn Spring 2010 Parkway Tree Planting Program

Deadline for 2010 tree planting applications is January 31st, 2010.

Deadline for 2011 tree planting applications is August 1st, 2010.

The Village of Oak Lawn will adjust its tree planting program to once per year starting in 2010. Allocations are nearly full. A few trees are still available. For a \$75 investment you receive a 2 to 2.5" caliper tree, delivered, installed, and mulched. Only \$65 for an oak tree!

Applications must be received by **January 31st** for consideration of planting this year. ***Applications received after this date will be planted in 2011.***

We answered: Voter's registration at the Oak Lawn Clerk's Office closed on January 5 and will reopen on Friday February 5. Grace Period Registration & Voting is ongoing through Tuesday, January 26 at the County Clerk's office (69 W. Washington) and the five suburban courthouse mini-centers. Hours are 9:00 am – 5:00 pm January 6-8, 11-16, 18-23 and 25-26. Sunday hours are 9:00 am – 3:00 pm January 17 and 24. Please bring two forms of identification.

You asked: Do you have Early Voting at the Village Hall?

Early voting is available in the Oak Lawn Clerk's Office through Thursday, January 28 on Mondays through Fridays, 9:00 am until 5:00 pm. The Clerk's Office will be open for ***early voting only*** Monday, January 18 and Saturdays January 16 and 23 from 9:00 am until 5:00 pm. Please bring one form of state identification

Caregiver Certificate Program

Aging parents – Tips for Caregivers

As adult children age, so do their parents and it is very likely that roles will reverse and adult children become the caregivers of their parents. As a caregiver for aging parents and/or those suffering from Alzheimers, you are faced with many challenges. The following tips are provided from the staff at Mayo Clinic www.mayoclinic.com:

- Evaluate the situation from a caregiver's perspective.
 - How safe is your parents' home?
 - How well are your parents taking care of themselves?
 - How are your parents' spirits?
 - Are your parents capable of getting around?
- Talk with your parents before making arrangements.
- Be prepared for an emergency.
- Compile a list of your parents' doctors, allergies, medications, surgeries, insurance information and other pertinent details.
- Discuss the possibility of long term health care, living wills and most importantly your parents' wishes.
- Seek help from other family members, friends or local social service agencies.
- Pay close attention to your own needs. Stress has a strong impact and can interfere with your caregiving skills.

McAULEY ECOMACS OPERATION HAITI

This week my office was contacted by a student, Katherine Kezon, from the Mother McAuley EcoMacs Club to inform him of “Operation Haiti”; a project that several students (EcoMac Biodiesel Team) are currently working on under the direction of Dr. Roz Iasillo, Chairperson of the Science Department at Mother McAuley High School. “Operation Haiti” will be entered into the Lexus Eco Challenge through The Power of Youth (a program empowering teens to take action and help the environment).

The EcoMac Biodiesel Team is currently building a solar-powered biodiesel generator for Lakal Pa Nou, a school in Pichon, Haiti. The generator will work off of seed oil that comes from the Jatropha, a native tree in Haiti that grows without irrigation and fertilization. The solar thermal conductor will also use direct solar heating to heat the tree seeds prior to pressing, because hot beans yield more oil.

The Biodiesel Team is working with local Haitian farmers to plant Jatropha for biodiesel oil production. The Haitian staff has made several batches of biodiesel on its own. The EcoMacs also are advising the school on how to make soap out of the glycerin byproduct which promises to be a high value product for local farmers.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees and the Village of Oak Lawn, I’d like to extend our congratulations to Dr. Roz and the EcoMac Biodiesel Team for their efforts in improving the quality of life for the residents of Pichon and their strong contributions to our ecology both locally and globally. Our community is proud!
