The Village of Oak Lawn Board of Trustees have amended the "Animal Control" Ordinance on Tuesday, January 10, 2012. Here are just some of the important changes in the ordinance:

Penalties for violations have increased.
Animals running at large prohibited.
No more than three four legged animals within one residence.
Inoculation of cats and ferrets.
All dogs and cats require a license.
All dogs and cats are prohibited from certain places.

SHOVELING TIPS FROM ADVOCATE CHRIST MEDICAL CENTER

What's the Scoop on Snow Shoveling



Winter storms and cold weather can present hazardous situations especially for the elderly and people with health problems. The American Heart Association reports an increase in heart attacks during shoveling snow, due to the combination of cold temperatures and physical exertion which increases the workload of the heart. The National Institute of Health estimates 100 deaths a year due to shoveling snow.

Snow shoveling is a known trigger for heart attacks because many people who shovel snow rarely exercise. Picking up heavy snow or pushing a heavy snow blower is equivalent to running full throttle on a treadmill.

To make snow shoveling safer the American Heart Association has provided some practical tips.

- Don't eat a heavy meal at least three hours before shoveling.
- Warm up by stretching prior to shoveling
- · Take frequent breaks
- Avoid caffeine and nicotine prior to shoveling
- · Drink plenty of water
- Use a small shovel or consider a snow blower
- Don't drink alcohol before or after shoveling
- Learn the heart attack warning signs and listen to your body
- Prevent hypothermia by dressing in layers

 Protect your back from injury by lifting correctly. Bend with your knees, avoid twisting motion.

Call your village, church, community group to see if they have volunteers available.

Who should think twice about shoveling snow?



Those most at risk for a heart attack include:

- · Anyone who already has had a heart attack
- · Anyone with a history of heart disease
- Anyone with high blood pressure or high cholesterol
- Smokers
- · Individuals leading a sedentary lifestyle

An individual that leads a sedentary lifestyle has a 100% increased risk of having a heart attack while shoveling snow.

PLOWS COUNCIL ON AGING: Senior Citizen Tax Deferral Program

Senior Citizens who are having trouble paying real estate taxes can apply for the **Senior Citizen Tax Deferral Program.** This State of Illinois program allows qualified persons to defer 100% of taxes up to 80% of your equity on their personal resident.

To qualify:

- You must be at least age 65 or older by June 1, 2012.
- * You annual household income must be \$50,000 or less.
- You must own the property and have resided there for at least 3 years.
- * There can be no delinquent real estate taxes owed on the residence.
- * The property must be insured against fire hazard loss for at least the amount of deferred taxes.
- * You must have written approval from your spouse if property is held jointly or from the trustee of the property in a qualifying trust.

Seniors with reverse mortgages should contact their lender before applying. Those with standard mortgages do not need lender approval to qualify.

Applications must be filed between January 1st and March 1st.

COMCAST INFORMATION

Comcast will be further enhancing its network in our community to deliver the world of all-digital entertainment to **all Comcast customers**. Following this enhancement, Comcast's Limited Basic Cable Service customers may receive more channels than they do today, and will receive crisp digital pictures and sound on every TV, with their channels delivered in a high quality digital format.

Customers currently subscribing to only the Limited Basic Cable Service Tier are able to receive those services today in an analog format. In order to bring these customers the features described above, starting on April 11, 2012, all Comcast video services will be transmitted exclusively in digital format. This means Limited Basic Cable Service customers will need to have a digital set-top box or digital adapter from Comcast, or a third party device with a CableCARD TM, for each non-digital television on which they wish to continue receiving Comcast video services. Please note that Limited Basic Cable Service customers with digital QAM tuner televisions will continue to receive Basic Service channels without a digital device. However, to see channels above the Basic Service tier, QAM turner TVs will need a digital device. The Basic Service channel line-up varies by area but in general includes local broadcast TV stations plus local government, education, and public access channels.

To make this enhancement as seamless as possible for our customers, Comcast will provide Limited Basic Cable Service customers digital equipment at no additional monthly service charge as follows:

- Customers subscribing to only Limited Basic Cable Service without digital equipment can receive one digital adapter for their primary TV and up to two digital adapters for additional TVs at no additional monthly service charge. Customers can receive additional digital adapters for \$0.50 per month.
- Customers subscribing to Limited Basic Cable Service who already have a digital set-top box on their primary TV can receive up to two digital adapters for additional TVs at no additional monthly service charge. Customers can receive additional digital adapters for \$0.50 each per month. (The use of a digital set-top box allows these customers to receive other services such as premium channels and to order pay-per-view programming.)

Customers who currently subscribe to service tiers other than Limited Basic Cable Service (i.e., digital packages) will be largely unaffected by this

process. Customers subscribing to a digital package already have a digital set-top box on their primary TV, and can obtain up to two digital adapters for their additional TVs at no additional monthly service charge (this includes any digital adapters they may have today.) Those customers can receive additional digital adapters for \$1.99 each per month. However, please note that to the extent these customers have non-QAM tuner televisions connected directly to Comcast (to receive Basic Service channels on those TVs), they will need to have a digital set-top box or digital adapter from Comcast, or a third party device with a CableCARD TM., for each such television on which they wish to continue receiving Comcast video services.




