STATE OF THE VILLAGE

On Tuesday, February 14th, Chamber members and guests filled the Astoria room at the Hilton Hotel in Oak Lawn as they listened to Mayor Dave Heilmann present the "State of the Village" address. The Mayor spoke of many pressing issues facing the Village, but noted that the Village has met these economic challenges by "doing more with less" and passing balanced budgets while not increasing the Village's property tax rate. The Mayor discussed the fact that sales tax revenues have risen from the declines in 2008 and are expected to be back to strong levels in 2012. Oak Lawn is ranked 18 out of 1,200 municipalities in total sales revenues. He noted the achievements made in all Village Departments in providing more efficient services to residents, advances in safety, the tremendous number of street and infrastructure improvements, and many economic developments from new businesses (Midwest Orthopedic, Stacked, Andy's Custard, Eva's Bridal new opening) to five renovated auto dealerships.

Mayor Heilmann discussed the important investments in our community and what the future holds for the Village of Oak Lawn. "Advocate Christ Medical Center is embarking on an expansion plan that will make this hospital the largest in the State of Illinois." He discussed the value of having a top hospital here in Oak Lawn and the Hospital's recent affiliation with MD Anderson, the number one cancer treatment center in the world. Residents will see new construction up and down 95th Street with the Advocate, Little Company, Bluestone Healthcare, and other anticipated projects. He discussed that the Village has purchased several properties at 111th & Cicero and working on making that development a reality in the near future.

The Mayor also provided the audience with one vision of possible enhancements to the Village Green to expand on the Village's success with various special events primarily held on the Green throughout the year with the long-term goal of providing a destination site for family entertainment at a reasonable price and within a short distance from their homes.

He closed by talking about how it is the residents and business owners, the people of Oak Lawn, who truly are its strength and make our future a bright one.
