On track to open Mid July – Early August

Little Company of Mary is in the process of completing construction on their building which is a 45,000 square foot Urgent Care Center at 6700 West 95th Street (formerly Bally's), which is a very positive development for all of Oak Lawn, and significantly for those on the west end of town. This three-story facility will include the southwest area's first nationally certified immediate care center, physician offices, lab and a state-of-the-art diagnostic imaging suite complete with MRI, CT, ultrasound, radiology and mammography. It will open Mid July – Early August of this year.





VILLAGE OF OAK LAWN **NEW POLICY FOR RECYCLING BATTERIES**

The Village of Oak Lawn has adopted a new policy concerning battery recycling. Rechargeable batteries can be dropped off at our E-Waste facility located at 5550 West 98th Street during our hours of operation: **Tuesday through Thursday from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and the second Saturday of each month between 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.**

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency recommends disposing of alkaline batteries with regular household trash. Alkaline batteries contain no hazardous waste and little recyclable materials. Previous environmental hazards associated with alkaline batteries were due to their mercury content. The Federal Battery Management Act of 1996 phased out the use of mercury in alkaline batteries and today few, if any, alkaline batteries contain mercury.

This is an ash tree. All ash trees in Oak Lawn are in some level of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) infestation and dying.

The ash trees on this block are scheduled for removal in 2012. The Village has 1,600 parkway ash trees to manage.

Replacement plantings on this block are scheduled to occur in the spring of 2013.

In 2010 the Village of Oak Lawn positively identified the invasive pest the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) within the Village limits. Approximately 1,600 parkway trees are at risk.
